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## **What to Bring to Camp**

Backpacking pack (This is a necessary piece of equipment for the week. If you do not own one, please borrow one from your unit / friend)

Daypack

Lightweight sleeping bag / pillow

2-man tent with groundcloth

Clothes for the week (BSA appropriate). Make sure to include a hoodie.

Raingear

Hiking boots AND athletic shoes. No open-toed shoes except in shower

Toiletries - soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, hair brush, shampoo

Towel(s)

Complete Field Uniform (Class A)

Water bottle(s)

Bug spray / suntan lotion

Pocket knife (BSA approved)

Hat / sunglasses

Personal first aid kit

Complete mess kit

Pens/pencils

Watch

Medication - any prescription medication should be in original container with name on it. It will be given to the medical officer at check in. All prescription/OTC medication approvals should be on medical form.

Inhalers / epi-pens should be kept and be easily accessible over the week.

**What NOT to bring: games, food, electronics of any kind.**  
**It is preferred that cellphones stay at home, if possible.**
