



CAMP SINOQUIPE DUTY TO GOD PROGRAM

While at Sinoquipe you will encounter God's handiwork on many occasions. The Duty to God program will allow you to reflect on that and earn the Duty to God Program patch.

Eligibility: Scouts and Scouters are eligible to participate in this program.

Program:

1. Participants must complete five requirements.
* These three requirements must be completed.
 - A.* Attend a religious service at camp.
 - B.* Help Chaplain with weekly camp service.
 - C. Lead a devotional at your troop campsite.
 - D. Lead grace before the Friday evening cookout, a prayer before a troop hike, troop activity or evening campfire.
 - E. With the Camp Rangers approval perform a service project at the Camp Chapel, troop campsite or a camp project to benefit the Lord's environment.
 - F.* Make a presentation to your unit on Religious Emblems.
 - G. Explain to your troop the World Scouting Friendship Fund.
2. Participants must obtain their Chaplain Aide's signature to certify completion of these requirements.

CAMP SINOQUIPE DUTY TO GOD PROGRAM

Here are some suggestions to fulfill the Duty to God program:

- A. Attend camp church service, and tell the Scouts and Leaders in your troop/crew when the service will be held. Chapel services are held Thursday evening at 7:00 p.m.
- B. Arrive early at the chapel. Ask the Chaplain what you can do to prepare for the service. You will be asked to do a reading, be a song leader or explain the World Scouting Friendship Fund at the chapel service.
- C. A devotional is a small prayer service. It can be held before the unit goes to breakfast or during the evening around the campfire. Use readings from the Old Testament.
- D. Talk to your troop Chaplain Aide about leading grace before the Wednesday evening cookout, lead a prayer before a troop hike, troop activity or the troop evening campfire.
- E. Possible chapel/camp service projects. Arrive early for the chapel service. Are the benches clean, pickup trash, or do a service project at the troop campsite, or a camp service project.
- F. Information is available at the Trading Post on the Religious Emblem program. Pickup the information early so you can read over the packet. If someone asked a question about emblems that you cannot find the answer, ask the Chaplain when he is at camp for the chapel service.
- G. Explain the World Scouting Friendship Fund to your troop or patrol before the Thursday evening chapel service. There will be a collection at the service for this fund. Information on the World Scouting Friendship Fund is available at the Trading Post.

These are just suggestions. You may try some of your own ideas. They must be approved by your Chaplain Aide, Scoutmaster or Camp Chaplain.
